MADISON CHORAL SOCIETY IN CONCERT

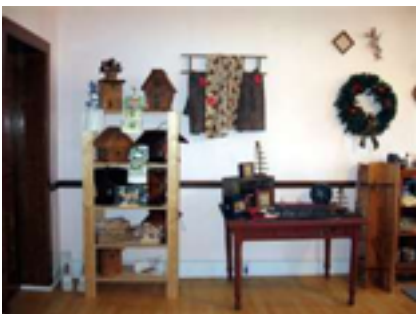
