On July 18th, five of our young people joined over 300 children and youth from around Virginia for a week of Music and Worship Arts Camp sponsored by Virginia Baptists at Eagle Eyrie. The camp is a wonderful opportunity for children to develop skills that enable them to enjoy a lifetime of music.

2011 was the first time in many years that OBC has taken a group to Music Camp. Our five youth ranged in ages from completed 4th grade through completed 9th grade. They joined forces with the group from Second Baptist Church in Richmond with whom they roomed, ate all meals, held devotions, and spent time in fellowship.

One focus of the week is choral singing. Each child was given a packet of music at the beginning of the week.

After many hours of rehearsal, at the end of the week they gave a concert. We had OBC parents and grandparents attend, able to see their children use what they had learned during the week.

The camp also offered opportunities other than choral singing. Some from our group enjoyed taking classes in handbells, banner-making, world drumming, guitar, and voice class. After their classes and experiences as a group, there were chances for them to hang out in the lodge, swim at the pool, visit the ice cream shop, as well as many other free time activities.

However, the camp is not all classes and free time; there were worship services each morning and evening. Our children were singing, hearing the gospel, and praying along side children from all across the state. OBC will continue to see the fruit of this camp for generations.

What is "Together for Hope"?

"Together for Hope" is an effort to break the cycle of poverty in the 20 poorest counties in the U.S. In 2001 the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship made a commitment to establish long-term relationships with local leaders, churches and organizations in the 20 poorest counties. The result has been the development of strategies to relieve poverty specific to the area.

An example is Allendale County in the southern part of South Carolina where the percentage of people with income below the poverty level is 43.8 percent. The unemployment rate is 22.5 percent, the highest in the state. CBF of SC has partnered with First Baptist Church of Allendale and other community groups to serve those living in poverty. Currently, backpacks are being filled with school supplies for school children in Allendale. Plans are being developed for a permanent ministry in Allendale County.
