Mission Focus Together for Hope

Together for Hope(TFH), a program launched in 2001 by Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, is a long-term commitment to working with people in 20 of the nation's poorest counties. The goal is to break the cycle of poverty by working with local residents, state and regional CBF groups, churches and other organizations to maximize the local resources and empower community members. TFH ministry involves establishing long-term relationships, listening, learning and walking alongside local leaders.

Greg Long, a Native American, has recently partnered with TFH. Greg was born and raised on the Navajo reservation in Arizona and was the first Navajo student to graduate from Baylor University, George W. Truett Theological Seminary.

Greg returned to his Navajo home community in Flagstaff, Arizona, where he is currently pastor of Selah Congregation, with a vision for his community, a community where abuse and genocide are rampant, unemployment exceeds 50% and residents lack running water and electricity. His vision is of self-sufficiency for the reservation residents through sustainable farming, tourism and a stronger infrastructure. Together for Hope is a resource for Greg and his community.

Rev. Long is "being the presence of Christ" to the Navajo. Contribute prayerfully and generously to CBF to sustain the ministry of Greg Long and all CBF field personnel.

Subject: Proposed Amendment to Article III, Church Council, Section (2) - Duties

Enclosure (1) - OBC Constitution and By-Laws, Articles of Faith sections

The following additional duty to be performed by the Church Council is hereby submitted for consideration and to be voted upon by the membership of Orange Baptist Church. I respectfully request this motion be presented in its present form, unedited without exclusion.

Proposed addition: Cause an impartial review of Orange Baptist Church's current affiliation with any and all Baptist organizations to include national conventions, state associations and local church affiliations for the purpose of ensuring that no such partnership is in conflict with OBC's "Articles of Faith" as defined in our Constitution and By-laws. The review will be conducted each January in year dates ending in zero (0) and five (5). The Church Council will conduct their review on the basis of comparing our Articles of Faith with the faith authority statement(s) and Baptist doctrine position(s) of the partnering organization(s). The Church Council will present their findings and recommendations to the membership in an open forum for discussion. The Church membership will then vote to retain, change or suspend any and all partnering relationships found inconsistent with our beliefs according to our Articles of Faith.
