#ENDHUNGER

Sue and Greg Smith, CBF personnel, are actively participating in CBF hunger missions and ministries in Fredericksburg, VA where they minister to Latino families.

The Smiths moved back to Fredericksburg in 1999 after serving more than a decade in Costa Rica. The Latino population in Fredericksburg had exploded and were struggling to survive in a new culture. In addition to a language barrier most Latino residents were not eligible for government assistance and the local church and community resources were not adequate to meet all their needs. Greg and Sue were challenged by the massive needs. They partnered with CBF of Virginia and colleagues Victor and Heather Gomez and created LUCHA, a cross-cultural ministry. LUCHA is the Spanish word for "struggle" and an acronym meaning "Latinos unidos por Cristo en Hermandad y apoyo" (English: "Latinos united through Christ in solidarity and support"). Greg Smith stated, "The aim of LUCHA Ministries is to provide a holistic Christian response to the needs of the Latino population in Fredericksburg".

Through LUCHA ministries the Latinos are provided access to food, medical and dental care. Sue and Greg often accompany individuals to appointments and meetings to provide interpretation.

The Smiths are able to be the presence of Christ and to promote #ENDHUNGER ministries because of support from the CBF Offering for Global Missions. Give prayerfully and generously to Global Missions to help #ENDHUNGER.
