

#### **MISSION FOCUS**

### Sam Bandela's Biographical Sketch

- Grew up in a small town in South India.
- Lost his mother to cancer at age 3.
- Was adopted by a missionary couple who had recently moved to his hometown.
- After finishing high school, left India to study at No. American Seminary in Sioux Falls, SD.
- In 1994 Bandela and his late wife, Latha, were commissioned by CBF to begin a ministry to the Southeastern Asian immigrants in Atlanta.
- Bandela felt called to minister in his own country and in 2000 accepted the CBF assignment to minister to unreached and unevangelized people groups in India.
- Has spread God's love through disaster relief ministry, planting numerous churches, establishing medical clinics in remote areas of India.
- His proudest ministry is establishment of multiple sewing centers with supporting partnership of Cooperative Baptists. Over 400 women, including widows and teenagers, are avoiding becoming trapped in prostitution and are supporting their families with pride.
