FINAL STATISTICAL REPORT OF CONSECRATION SUNDAY RESULTS

A total of 132 giving units completed *Estimate of Giving* Cards this year.

A total of 50 of these giving units increased their financial commitment above their last year's amount.

A total of 132 giving units that completed an *Estimate of Giving* Card committed a total of \$220,061.32.

Based on last year's giving records, we can expect to receive \$100,479.26 during the coming year from people who have consistent giving patterns during the past twelve months but did not complete a card.

Based on the average total of loose offerings during the past three years, we can expect to receive \$3,658.84 during the coming year from that source.

Church income from non-donor sources such as interest, rentals, and fees \$1,274.50.

This gives us a grand total of \$325,473.93 anticipated income for the next twelve months.

The total income for our unified budget during the last twelve months was \$271,050.00.

Next year, we can expect our unified budget income to increase by \$54,423.93.

This is a 17 percent increase in total giving above last year.
