UPCOMING AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS AT BUSINESS MEETING MARCH 17, 2013

Proposed Amendments to the By-Laws (from the Church Council)

Article II: Membership, Section 1 - Qualification, last sentence

Current wording: After such counsel [by the Pastor and/or Deacons], the candidate [for Church membership] shall be presented to the Church for a vote on his membership at either the next business meeting or Sunday worship service two weeks hence.

Proposed change: After such counsel, the candidate shall be presented to the church for a vote on his membership.

Article III: Church Officers, Clerk, #12-13

Current wording #12: issue letters of transfer or withdrawal upon request and report such action at the next business meeting

Proposed change to #12: becomes #13 saying – issue letters of transfer or withdrawal upon request

Current wording #13: issue letters of sanction or discipline by the Deacons or the Church and report such action at the next business meeting

Proposed change to #13: becomes #14 with no change in wording

Insert new #12: report any changes in membership at each business meeting (new members, transfers of membership, withdrawals)
