Ministry to Internationals

In Mathew 2:13-15 Joseph, Mary and Baby Jesus were instructed to leave Bethlehem to escape the evil plans of King Herod to murder Baby Jesus. They traveled to Egypt seeking safety and refuge. As refugees in a strange land Joseph, Mary and Baby Jesus became dependent on those around them to learn a new culture and strategies to adjust in a new land.

Butch and Nell Green, Cooperative Baptist Fellowship field personnel in Houston, help hundreds of immigrants, refugees and international students navigate a new culture each year. The Greens are being the presence of Christ by assisting the new comers in finding shelter, sources of food and in connecting them with local resources such as job prospects, medical care and education. Butch Green said, "Refugees, immigrants and international students are our neighbors and we have a responsibility as Christians, as churches, to reach out with the love of Christ."

Part of the Green's ministry is equipping individuals and congregations to become partners in meeting the myriad needs of their new neighbors. Tallowood Baptist Church in Houston has collected furniture for refugee families and school supplies for refugee children. South Main Baptist Church in Houston is reaching out to their often-misunderstood Muslim neighbors. Clear Lake Baptist Church in Houston offered a video simulcast on how to reach out to their Muslim neighbors. Surprisingly, about 50 local Muslims attended. The event evolved into an hour long dialogue about their faith and beliefs.
