#### **MISSION FOCUS**

Partnership: Many Meanings

Trey and Jennifer Lyon are giving new meaning to partnership as they serve with Park Avenue Baptist Church in southeast Atlanta. "After exploring communities across the world in which to plant their ministry" the Lyons felt called to Atlanta where their backgrounds in social services and youth ministry are a perfect fit. The Lyons were commissioned as CBF personnel in 2011.

Park Avenue Baptist Church, once a vibrant, active church, declined in recent years. Many local residents thought the church had closed. Tony Lankford, current pastor and friend of the Lyons, was committed to renewing the church. Upon learning of the Lyon's interest in Park Ave. pastor Lankford invited Trey and Jennifer to partner with Park Avenue Baptist.

Since joining the ministry with Park Avenue the Lyons have developed a summer literacy camp which has spread to several sites, a summer leadership camp and are utilizing space in the church building called Lydia's House for hosting mission groups from across the country. These are a few examples of the ministries at Park Ave. Trey said, "Our dream is that this ministry placement can be a field-lab for CBF churches and individuals to come and serve and learn."
