## A Pastoral Appeal

I appeal to you . . . invite you . . . encourage you. . . exhort you . . . to attend the Introduction to Spiritual Disciplines on Sunday, June 7, 3-5 p.m. in the Pine Room. I guess you figured out that I consider this a high priority for OBC.

The Dawnings Team, through prayerful discernment about God's vision for OBC, believes that God is wanting each of us to grow deeper in our relationship with God. We are a people who are so busy doing church that we might miss being the church. A viable congregation is about being on God's mission. In order to discern God's mission for us together and individually, we need to hear from God. #### MISSIONS IN DIVERSITY

Why would the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship assign Carson and Laura Foushee, field personnel, to Japan when Japan is:

- a First World country
- the third richest country in the world
- one of the least responsive countries to the gospel
- a country with a history of Christianity that dates back hundreds of years
- a country that practices Shinto religion (80%) and Buddhism (43%)
- a country in which 1% of the population is Christian?

Typically, the CBF assigns field personnel to unreached people groups and the poor or marginalized. Carson and Laura are ministering in Japan as a result of a request from Rev. Taguchi.

Rev. Akinori Taguchi, pastor of Kanazawa Baptist: Church in Japan had a strong vision for collaboration and eventual partnership with a Baptist organization. An invitation was issued to CBF from THE HISTORIC: Japan Baptist Convention. The result is the assignment in 2013 of Carson and Laura Foushee to Japan, CBF's first field personnel to Japan. Carson, a native of Statesville, NC and Laura, a native of Raleigh, NC are graduates of Mercer University's McAfee School of Theology. "Christians in Japan are strongly encouraged: by our presence," Carson said. "In the end, people are: looking for community and relationship," said Laura. That is their focus as Carson and Laura lead Bible: studies, co-pastor two churches and teach English to university students, kindergartners and their mothers.

#### **GOOD WORK**

In 1666, world-famous architect Sir Christopher Wren was tasked with helping to rebuild London after the city was nearly destroyed by fire. On one occasion, he visited the site of a cathedral under construction--one of his designs. Seeing a day laborer working high up on a scaffold, he called out and asked the man what he was working on. Not recognizing the inquirer, the laborer called back with pride, "I'm helping Sir Christopher Wren build a cathedral!"

Now, it would have been perfectly honest and acceptable if the worker had yelled back, "I'm shingling the roof!" or "I'm laying bricks!" He could have even said something like, "I'm earning a living!" and that too would have been the truth. But he had a much grander perspective of his work. He didn't just see the task before him. He was the good that would come from his efforts--a completed cathedral. The laborer also saw the uniqueness of his opportunity. He wasn't just working on any old church; he was helping Christopher Wren build a church.

Work can be something to put food on the table, it can be something from which we draw our identity, or like the worker in the story, it can become something transcendent, instilling a sense of purpose, satisfaction and joy.
