Mission Focus

"Praying with our Feet"---"Step by Step"

That is the title of their e-newsletter but also describes the response of Jon and Tanya Parks to their call to serve as missionaries. Jon and Tanya were commissioned as CBF Field Personnel in 2011 to minister to the Roma of Slovakia. The Roma are treated as outcasts and are denied the privilege to integrate into the communities in which they live. The Parks are building relationships with the Roma while teaching conversational English and sharing their knowledge of music and technologies.

When asked why they chose that title (or guiding principle) Jon and Tanya responded, "We chose this name because we consider our recent calling....to be another step in the journey God has laid out for us. We chose this name because not matter how we might try to map out what we think God wants us to do, the simple fact is we won't know what is ahead until we're willing just to take that next step. And in that way, taking the next step is a way of 'praying with our feet'".

CBF of Virginia Council has adopted the annual theme of "Step By Step: Walking Together in Community" (I Peter 2:21). Our missionary focus is Jon and Tanya Parks. In keeping with that theme CBFVA Mission Box is a special mission project in partnership with <u>Soles4Souls</u> which collects and distributes shoes (and clothing) to needy persons and micro finance organizations around the world. <u>Soles4Souls</u>, founded in 2004, is a global not-for-profit institution dedicated to fighting poverty. "Gently used" footwear is refurbished and recycled, thereby preventing tons of trash from filling our landfills.
