



MOTION FOR BUSINESS MEETING SUN., OCTOBER 18 12:15 PM

The Facilities Team withdrew the original motion listed in August 2015 *The Chronicle*. After hearing discussion at the Town Hall Meeting on Aug. 19 the following motion addresses concerns raised. The motion was presented at the Sept. 20 meeting. A final vote on the motion will occur at the October business meeting.

The Facilities Team moves:

1. That the members of the congregation authorize the Facilities Team to proceed with renovations of the kitchen at a cost of \$20,000, and to contract with R.W. Kilby to proceed with renovations to the Pine Room to include adding three bathrooms and repair to drainage line at a cost of \$80,000.

2. That the \$100,000 project be financed by member offerings that are over and above gifts to the unified budget.

3. That a line of credit not to exceed \$80,000 be established to facilitate contractor payments while offerings are being collected.

4. That the Church Emergency Council shall convene to decide how to make payment to line of credit should member offerings for the renovation be insufficient.

MISSION FOCUS

Asset-Based Community Development

Michael Hutchinson says, "We believe there are Togolese solutions for Togolese problems. Each community has assets waiting to be identified and developed." Michael and Lynn Hutchinson serve as CBF field personnel in Togo, a French-speaking country in West Africa. Togo, an underdeveloped tropical country, is about the size of West Virginia. It is the 10th poorest nation and lacks the natural resources such as oil and diamonds found in other African nations. There are few sources of income and a scarcity of nutritional food.

The Hutchinsons believe that long-lasting community development depends on identifying and developing assets that are indigenous. Assets that can be developed into income-producing activities, that are feasible, sustainable and accessible to all.

The African bush rat, a large (8-20 lbs.) rodent is such an asset. The meat of the bush rat is considered desirable to many West Africans and is an excellent source of Protein. To develop a business using the rats, an individual owner of rats loans 5 rats to a prospective business person. The rats multiply and the person who loaned the rats is repaid with 10 rats. The pattern continues. Raising bush rats was an idea initiated by the Peace Corp several years ago but the Hutchinsons are developing the business on a broad scale. A similar approach is used to develop businesses using rabbits. The Hutchinsons believe that Asset-Based Community Development demonstrates God's love and His desire for each of us to become all that He has created us to be.
