World Hunger and CBF

Have you ever been hungry.....REALLY hungry?? So hungry that you have chronic abdominal pain and have lost any desire to work, study or play due to lack of energy? Out of the world population of 7.1 billion, 852 million are hungry. One in eight people go to bed hungry every night. Each year, 2.6 million children die as a result of hunger-related causes. More than one in five children live in households that struggle to put food on the table. Hunger kills more people every year than aids, malaria and tuberculosis combined.

Ironically, enough food is produced in the world to provide every person with an adequate diet. A major problem is access to food. Another problem is that many people do not have sufficient land to grow, or income to purchase, enough food.

CBF is committed to #EndHunger, a ministry to help solve the hunger problem. CBF Hunger Ministries exist in 20 countries on 4 continents. *Together for Hope* is CBF's Rural Poverty Initiative. TFH is a long-term commitment to working with people in 20 of the poorest counties in the US. Most CBF field personnel are involved in hunger ministries. Sue and Greg Smith who minister to the Latino community in the Fredericksburg area maintain a food pantry and partner with the local food bank to provide food to the Latinos. Chaouki and Maha Boulos, CBF field personnel serving in Lebanon, are working to #EndHunger for Syrian refugees through various means of food distribution. Anna and Lacount Anderson minister in Halifax Co., NC, one of the poorest counties in the US. They promote a community garden which supplements the local food bank. Gennady and Mina Podgaisky, serving in Ukraine, feed children on the street and help to find foster care.

Help #EndHunger and impact CBF's Global Missions work by giving generously and prayerfully to the Offering for Global Missions.
